Max looked surprised but nodded. Tommy climbed up carefully, using his swimming skills to stay balanced. When he reached Max, he said, "It's okay. I've got you."


Tommy helped Max find his footing and guided him down safely. The other kids cheered. Max looked at Tommy and said, "Thanks. I didn't think anyone would help me."
