Scene 1: Fourth-Grade Science Classroom

(The classroom is buzzing with excitement. Mrs. Thompson stands at the front.)

Narrator: The students in Mrs. Thompson’s science class are starting a fun project about cats and their eating habits.

Mrs. Thompson: Class, we are going to explore the eating habits of cats. I want each group to come up with a creative question about why cats eat the way they do.

(They go to the pet store and return with various cat foods and candies. They set up a table with different bowls.)



Jake: Let's see what Whiskers picks. (holds the camera)

(Whiskers sniffs the bowls and walks straight to the cat food.)

Mia: Look! She likes the cat food!

Leo: But why doesn't she go for the sweets?

Sam: Maybe we should find out if she can taste them. Let's hold our noses and try some of the sweet treats ourselves!

(Everyone pinches their noses and takes a piece of candy.)

Jake: Yuck! I can barely taste it!

Mia: (giggling) It's like eating without flavor!

Leo: This is just like how cats can't taste sweets. They have a special gene that doesn't let them enjoy sweet things!

(They record their findings excitedly.)

Emma: We should share this with Mrs. Thompson!

Scene 3: Back in the Classroom

(The students present their project to Mrs. Thompson.)

Mia: We found out that cats prefer savory foods over sweets! We even tested it ourselves by holding our noses!

Mrs. Thompson: (smiling) What a creative way to learn! Great job, everyone! You all earn A's for your teamwork and exploration.

Class: Thank you, Mrs. Thompson!

(The curtain falls as the students cheer.)
